EMIDEC 1100 Delivery list and applications.

The EMIDEC 1100 was launched in 1959. The first machine to go to a customer was delivered to Boots the Chemists at Nottingham on 28th April 1960 and started working on 5th September 1960 (see references 8 and 3 in section M1X5). The EMIDEC 1100 became the ICT 1101 in the summer of 1962, upon the merger of EMI's computer interests with International Computers and Tabulators (ICT). The designation '1101' was also used to signify machines with extended main memory – see section M1X2.

Further notes on the history and dates of the EMI company's involvement in computer design, together with a full list of references, will be found in section M1X5.

Since the delivery dates of some of the EMIDEC 1100 computers are not known with certainty, the machines are listed alphabetically by customer below.
